Free activities for children and young people

Food and Fun Hollday Programme

Southwark Council runs a school holiday activity and food programme for children aged 4 to 16 on benefits-related free school meals. It runs during the Easter, summer and winter school holidays.

Ideas for days out together

London Parks

Easter usually brings the first hint of springtime sunshine, so if that's the case, there's nowhere better to head than to one of London's green spaces. Some popular local parks include **Dulwich Park** and **Centre for Wildlife Gardening** in East Dulwich, or **Burgess Park** that stretches from Walworth to Peckham. If you feel like venturing outside of your local parks, then **Kew Gardens** is running <u>Supertato family activities</u> over the Easter break!

Explore London's museums and galleries

If the weather takes a turn, why not retreat to one of London's vast museums? They're bound to spark your child's imagination. There's a treasure trove for every interest: visit Brunel Museum for an exciting journey into the world of gardening with their "Wild Things" club for children (8th April, tickets available online), delve into medicine and space at the Science Museum, uncover fossils and dinosaurs at the Natural History Museum, or explore the history of London's public transport at the London Transport Museum, with interactive exhibits and a play area for younger childre.

Go and meet some animals

There are a handful of really great city farms in London that are family-friendly and Easter is a wonderful time to visit, with most offering the chance to meet some freshly hatched chicks or bottle feed some lambs. In the south, there's Yauxhall City Farm, which is notable for its alpacas, Surrey Docks Farm in Rotherhithe, who also offer activities during the school holidays for those aged 8-13 which can be booked online for a fee, and the Horniman Museum Animal Walk, home to goats, sheep, guinea pigs, rabbits, chickens and alpacas.
