News and Reminders

School Data

While we assess children's progress and attainment continuously throughout their time at school, there are various points at which data is collected and shared beyond the school. These include the GLD (Good Level of Development) at the end of Reception, the phonics check in Year 1, the times table check in Year 4 and the Year 6 SATs. As a proudly inclusive school with children with a wide range of starting points and diverse needs, we know that these assessments do not reflect every child's achievements and we celebrate every child's individual progress against their own targets. However, we are also very proud of the outcomes we have achieved and are pleased to be able to share all of Bessemer's data for this year, with our data from last year and the national levels for comparison. As this year's national data is not all available yet we are using some 2024 and 2023 data for comparison, however this tends not to vary by more than around 1% each year. You will see that Bessemer data is significantly above national averages in all areas and above our own data from last year in nearly all areas. This is a reflection of the hard work and dedication of all of our wonderful teaching and support staff, and of course the hard work of the children – well done Bessemer!



Online Safety Tip of the Week

Online Gaming and Neurodivergence:

In April, Internet Matters, in partnership with Roblox, published a report of their study about neurodivergent young people's relationships to online gaming.

The report found that neurodivergent young people spend a lot of time playing online games: 93% play Roblox, over 9 in 10 are playing video games with other people online, over 9 in 10 are playing video games by themselves offline and more than 4 in 5 are making their own content online, e.g. livestreaming themselves as they game.

They found that there were lots of benefits for young people from gaming online (it makes them happy, improves communication and they make friends online), and that most young people had an awareness of online safety and how to get help. The findings helped Internet Matters and Roblox find better ways to support young people and their carers to stay safe while gaming online.
