Celebrating Black History Month

We strongly believe that our curriculum should be reflective of our school population at Bessemer, with Black history embedded in our history curriculum and taught throughout the year. However, we think that it is also important to celebrate Black History Month in October each year, as this month brings all of the UK together to celebrate Black history, culture and achievements. Black History Month (BHM) runs through October and classes throughout the whole school will be completing various activities to mark it.

On Tuesday 10th October, all children in Year 1 to 6 took part in the 'Great Big Live Assembly,' which focused on Black History Month.







We will also be having an assembly on the 18th that focuses on significant women of colour - our pupil 'history champions' will be helping with this.

In Early Years and Year 1, story time over the month of October will focus on a *Little People, Big Dreams* book celebrating the lives of black women in line with this year's BHM theme 'Saluting Our Sisters'. Children will read about a number of black women including Mae Jamison, Rosa Parks and Wilma Rudolph.

In Year 2 children will create artwork by Lubania Hamid and find out all about Harriet Tubman.

This week children from Year 3 and 4 joined authors and illustrators Robert Tregoning, Patrice Lawrence, and Viviane Schwarz in a live-streamed session to inspire children to step inside their own stories and make zig-zag books.

On the 30th October, Year 5 will take part in an online workshop run by the brilliant National Archives, where they will be using their historical enquiry skills to examine sources to learn about Black Victorians. They will further explore this theme by researching Sarah Forbes and Bonetta Davies.

This week, Year 6 have combined BHM and National Poetry day by exploring and performing poems by Maya Angelou. They have also worked on presentations about "Sheroes Among Us," highlighting contemporary black women who are breaking barriers and shattering stereotypes in their respective fields.


World Mental Health Day
