News and Reminders

Home Learning

Children learn best when home and school work together, so at Bessemer we provide lots of opportunities for parents and carers to get involved in their children's learning. The only elements of home learning that we consider compulsory are home reading and homework in Year 6 (in preparation for the expectations in secondary school) however we do encourage you to complete some home learning tasks and children will receive rewards in school for doing so. Paper copies of homework are usually provided, however all homework tasks can also be found on Google Classroom.

Reading

We expect every child to read at home every day, whether from their school reading book or a book, newspaper or magazine of their choice. When your child reads at home please sign their reading diary. For every five home reads children get a sticker, and every time they reach 50 reads they receive a certificate.

Spelling

We teach spelling lessons throughout the week in school and the children take part in a collaborative spelling test at the end of the week, when they work together to recall spelling patterns and spell words. The week's spelling words are given out for children to practise at home as well as in school.

Maths


Children in KS2 get a piece of maths homework each week. Children are encouraged to complete this for additional practice of the skills being taught in school. Our maths homework is designed to support children in meeting the maths rocket targets for their year group.

All children should have a Timestable Rockstars login, please ask your child's teacher if you don't have one. Timestable Rockstars is very a very effective way of learning multiplication and division facts, which is key to becoming a confident mathematician. When children use Timestable Rockstars for a few minutes a day they make very noticeable progress. We are currently relaunching Timestable Rockstars as explained in the poster at the end of the newsletter.

Topic Homework

Each half term we send home a Knowledge Organiser for your child's half termly topic, which includes their topic homework. Topic homework is made up of fun, creative tasks and suggestions for visits or activities which will give children a better understanding of their topic. Topic homework can be completed in the scrap books we provide, or uploaded to Google Classroom.

To celebrate National Poetry Day, we are encouraging children to make, experience and share poetry with family and friends.

You will have seen a letter addressed to Parents and Carers, inviting children and families to create and share a video of themselves performing a poem. This can either be related to the the theme of 'Refuge' or can simply be one of your children's favourite poems or something that the children have created.

In order for you to get involved, Parents and Carers have been asked to create a video of their child/children performing their poem (adults are welcome to join in too!) and upload this to their year group's Google Classroom page by Monday 2nd October. There will be an assignment entitled National Poetry Day. Teachers will then, on that day, share these videos with their class. We would also love to put some of these performances on the school website.

After School Club Booking

Bookings for after school club should be made in advance on Parentmail whenever possible. We need advance notification of numbers to ensure that we have appropriate staffing levels and catering. We do understand that occasionally you will need childcare at the last minute, so on the day bookings are accepted, however it is not possible to make same day bookings on Parentmail. If you need to book a last-minute place you can do so by emailing or calling the school office. However, because this leads to additional admin and catering, there is a £5 extra charge for on the day bookings. If the reason for your last-minute booking is an unavoidable emergency, please explain this when you contact us and the £5 extra charge may be waived.

Sharing Children's Learning

Last Friday children in Year 2 launched their *Pirates* topic with an immersion day during which they dressed up as pirates, spoke like pirates, chose their own pirate names, ate pirate biscuits and hunted for treasure. Everyone had a fantastic day!


















Word of the Week


