

News and Reminders

School Street

As you may now be aware, there are plans in place to remove the road closure barriers outside Bessemer in January.

These barriers were put in place several years ago following a lengthy consultation and trial period and have been a great success. They have made drop off and pick up time much safer for children moving between the two school sites, have improved the air quality by ensuring that cars are not parked with their engines running outside the school gates and have created a space where children and their families can safely walk, scoot, cycle and socialize before and after school.

As a school we are strongly against the removal of the barriers. We feel that the children are now so used to the road closure that the removal of the barriers will make the road more dangerous for them than it was before the barriers were introduced as the children are now out of the habit of observing usual road safety precautions. We do not feel that the traffic cameras offer the same protection as the barriers as they do not physically stop vehicles driving through the closure zone.

We are very grateful for the amazing support that we have received from parents, carers and our wider community so far and particularly to Alan Foster and other members of F@B for organizing our response. The petition currently has over 400 signatures, but the aim is to collect 1500 before presenting the petition to the Mayor of Southwark.

Don't forget to visit our little lending library, located just outside the office next to the lost property. Come and borrow a book or swap the one you got at the pop-up book shop for a new one.


Sharing Children's Learning

Free to enter.


Registration and submissions are open from 08th January - 27 March 2024.

How can I enter?

Submitting artwork is completely free and is done online. First, a teacher needs to register your school. Once the school is registered, your artwork can be submitted. If you're 12 or under, a teacher or parent/guardian will need to enter for you; if you're 13 or over you can submit artwork yourself.

Each student can submit one artwork and there is no theme. When you enter, we'll ask for an image of your artwork plus some information about the piece such as title, size, and a little text about the artwork and why you made it. Your artwork will be seen by our <u>panel of judges</u> and the selected pieces will be shown in our online exhibition. Some of the artworks will also be shown at the Royal Academy of Arts.

There is also a £350 package which includes the 2 days training plus 2 additional evening online workshops and individual feedback on two video clips the attendees submit.


