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

News and Reminders

Tutorial Day

Friday 9th February is tutorial day. This means that school is closed to children on that day and parents and carers have appointments with their child's teacher throughout the day. Number Day

On Friday 2nd February we are celebrating NSPCC Number Day. Children are invited to dress up in outfits relating to numbers and we will collect donations for the NSPCC on the gates in the morning. During maths lessons on Number Day children will be completing maths puzzles and other fun maths activities – look out for photos in next week's newsletter and on X.

Times Tables Workshop

On Wednesday 31st January Sheryl Burton is leading a short times table workshop. This is primarily for parents and carers of children in Year 4 as they will be taking part in the national times table check in the summer term. This check takes place because it is expected that by the end of Year 4 all children know their times tables up to the 12 times table as this knowledge is key to their ongoing mathematical progress. Please do try to attend this workshop as Sheryl will be sharing strategies for teaching and retaining times tables. Parents and carers of children in Year 3 can also attend, and parents and carers of any children in years 5 and 6 who are struggling with times tables are also very welcome. The workshop will take place at 9.10am in the lower hall.

Measles

We have received the following message from Public Health:

We are seeing much higher than normal levels of measles in London this year, including in Southwark schools. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools, and is a nasty illness and in some children can be very serious and lead to hospitalisation — and in rare cases tragically can cause death. People in certain at-risk groups including babies and young children, pregnant women, and people with weakened immunity, are at increased risk of complications if they catch measles.
