Science Week – resources needed!

During science week at the end of April the children will be competing in an egg drop challenge in school. In preparation for this we are welcoming any donations of materials such as toilet rolls, straws, disposable cups, balloons, egg boxes, bubble wrap, plastic bags, cardboard boxes and string. During science week we will also be enjoying the brilliant science shows from the Royal Institute and we will be sharing ideas for science experiments that you can carry out at home and details of a fun science competition.

Earth Day

On April 22nd we will be recognising Earth Day 2024 across the school. Earth Day is an annual event to demonstrate support for environmental protection; the theme this year is Planet vs. Plastics. We will be having a screen-free day across the school, with all lessons being taught without technology and outside where possible. Children will be spending time in the nature garden, learning about how we can do more for our environment and creating some environment-related art.

TimesTable Rockstars

We are happy to be able to announce the winners of the first Bessemer Scratch competition!

We were so pleased to see the amazing projects children had been working on, and the Computing Ambassadors had the best time getting to test out the games that had been made. It was difficult deciding who the final winners would be. We debated which we thought were the worthiest winners and held a vote which was very tight in many cases.

Overall, we hope that everyone has as much fun making their projects as we have had playing them. And, even if you didn't submit a project to the competition, we hope that some of you got to try out Scratch at home for the first time and show parents and carers something about what you have been learning to do at school and the cool things you can do with it.

The winners all received a BBC Micro:Bit, which is a programmable device that is able to sense sound, movement and light. The software can be accessed free online and can be used by anyone - even if you do not have a Micro:Bit. <u>https://makecode.microbit.org/</u>
