School Reports

Children's end of year reports will be shared on Compass by the end of next week. If you cannot access your child's report by Friday, or if you would like to make an appointment to discuss your child's report, please contact the school office.

Your child's report will include the details of their class for next year and their new teacher's name. Children will then spend some time in their new classroom with their new teacher on Monday 14th July.

Sports Days

Please make sure that your child wears their PE kit, including their gem house t-shirt (on this occasion only children are asked to wear a t-shirt in their house colour if they do not have a gem t-shirt, but no football kits please). All children must wear trainers to take part in sports day.

Children will be outside most of the day on their sports day so please ensure that they are wearing sun cream and have a hat and water bottle.

If you are not joining your child for lunch on sports day, or are not bringing a picnic, please remember that you must book a school packed lunch on Parentmail. The deadline for this was today, so if you have not done so please book now! If you are bringing lunch for your child please could you state this on Parentmail by selecting *home lunch* – this helps us to work out whether school lunches are not needed or just haven't been booked.

Other Upcoming Events for Parents and Carers to Attend

There is a picnic for all new Reception children (starting Reception in September) in the nature garden next Friday (11th July). Please bring a picnic and a blanket and come and meet your child's new class! The picnic is from 12-1pm and children must be taken to the picnic by their parent / carer. Our current Nursery children need to be collected from Nursery, taken to the picnic and then taken back to Nursery or taken home afterwards.

There is a transition meeting for current Reception parents and carers to share information about the move from Reception to Year 1 at 9.15am on Thursday 17th July.

The Year 6 production takes place at 6pm on Wednesday 16th July. Two adults per child are invited to come and watch.

Our whole school Carnival is on Thursday 17th July. Please come and join us, the parade starts at 2pm.

The Year 6 graduation is at 2pm on Monday 21st July, two adults per Year 6 child are invited to come and celebrate the children's time at Bessemer.

Toilets

Parents and carers are welcome to use the adult toilets next to the office. However, children will still be in school whilst other sports days are taking place so please keep trips to the bathroom to a minimum to avoid disturbing lessons. Please do not take your child into school to go to the toilet. School adults will be advising children when to go to the toilet. If your child needs to go during lunchtime, they should be taken by their teacher.

Awards and Competition

Children are competing for their gem house in the gem house sports day cup. Each key stage has their own cup. Children who come first in an event, will earn points for their gem house. Most competitions are gem house competitions, with a few exceptions, such as the sprint. However, we do want to track the best score for each year group to create a set of Bessemer records for each event. Each teacher will also decide on a greatest sports person from the day who displayed determination, teamwork and respect. These awards will be given at a celebration assembly following the completion of all sports days.

Lunches and lunchtime

Please adhere to the following guidelines when planning your picnic or your child's packed lunch:

Please do not include; nuts or nut products, e.g. peanut butter, un-cut grapes, sweets, chocolate bars (biscuits with some chocolate coating are acceptable) or fizzy drinks.

During lunchtime, the usual school rules will still apply. Please make sure that your child continues to behave in a way that is appropriate for school and sets a good example for Bessemer.

We are very fortunate to have access to JAGS for events such as these. Please make sure you leave the field as you found it by taking all litter with you.

Online Safety Tip of the Week

When is it an appropriate age to give your child their first phone? Should children have Smartphones? What are the risks of having an internet enabled device at a young age?

As a parent, it can be overwhelming to make a decision about when to give your child their first phone, and even their first smartphone with ready access to the Internet and the various social media apps.

In some ways, having their own phone can be a great opportunity for children to develop independence, but having clear rules and expectations is also important, as well as having safeguards to ensure that children are not exposed to inappropriate content or other harms from social media. It is also important to remember that Smartphones are now banned in many secondary schools and that this is likely to extend to primary schools in the near future.




