
Congratulations to this half term's house captains; Rufus, Yabai, Khadijah and Polly.

Online Safety Tip of the Week

Online Gaming and Neurodivergence:

In April, Internet Matters, in partnership with Roblox, published a report of their study about neurodivergent young people's relationships to online gaming.

The report found that neurodivergent young people spend a lot of time playing online games: 93% play Roblox, over 9 in 10 are playing video games with other people online, over 9 in 10 are playing video games by themselves offline and more than 4 in 5 are making their own content online, e.g. livestreaming themselves as they game.

They found that there were lots of benefits for young people from gaming online (it makes them happy, improves communication and they make friends online), and that most young people had an awareness of online safety and how to get help. The findings helped Internet Matters and Roblox find better ways to support young people and their carers to stay safe while gaming online.


