News and Reminders

Knowledge Organisers and Topic Homework

Children in Years 1, 2, 5 and 6 have new knowledge organisers and topic homework for next half term, please look at these over the holiday and think about doing some research or visiting some suggested places of interest for the upcoming topic. Children in Years 3 and 4 are continuing with their *Romans* topic so should carry on with the knowledge organiser and topic homework provided at the beginning of this half term.

Packed Lunches and Snacks

Please remember that as a Healthy School we have rules around what is allowed to be included in children's daily packed lunches. Children are not allowed crisps, chocolate bars / biscuits, cake / cake bars, sweets or any drink other than water. If children bring these items in their lunches they will not be allowed to eat them. (There are more relaxed rules for school trips, but still no sweets, large chocolate bars or fizzy drinks.) Morning snacks for KS2 children must be either fruit, vegetables or plain rice cakes or bread sticks. Snacks for after school activity clubs must be small, quick and reasonably healthy, e.g. fruit, crackers or a cereal bar.

Nuts, nut products and uncut grapes are not allowed in school or on trips at all. Please check cereal bars etc to ensure they do not contain nuts.

Last Friday was NSPCC Number Day. We raised money for the NSPCC by dressing up in number related outfits and enjoyed fun maths games and puzzles:
































Sharing Children's Learning


