- ➤ If a teacher is unwell and unable to produce remote lessons, lessons will be provided for that class by partner teachers within the school, or within the federation if necessary.
- ➤ If teachers are required to attend school to provide childcare for vulnerable children or children of keyworkers during a lockdown, lessons will be provided for that class by partner teachers within the school, or within the federation if necessary.
- > Weekly small group discussion sessions will take place with the class teacher.
