Update on Keyworth's expanded reopening to all year groups

Dear Parents/Carers,

Last week I wrote to offer all families the possibility of a return to Keyworth from Monday 29th June, in response to the government guidance that schools can open further if they are able to safely do so. We have been inundated with interest and messages of support from our school community, so for this I would like to thank you. **The deadline for a return before the summer holidays has now passed** and for families who made the decision not to return to Keyworth just yet, we look forward to seeing you again in September. We will provide further details on this when we have more information.

For families who made the decision to contact the school office to say that they would like their child/children to return, I am pleased to inform you that, having considered the numbers across all year groups, the availability of staff, the space across our site and our risk assessment, we are able to offer places for all of your children. We are really happy to be able to do this and ask for your support in making a return to Keyworth as successful for everyone as it can be. Please take note of the following information to help your child/children transition safely and happily back into school.

School start and end time

- Please remember the importance of children arriving to and being collected from school on time each
 day. This is to reduce the number of people using pathways/gates and therefore support social/physical
 distancing.
- At home time, we will bring children to their designated gate. Children will be asked to line-up before they are dismissed.
- A reminder that parents/carers are not allowed on site so will need to leave their children at their designated gate at the start of the day, with school staff supervising this. At the end of the day, staff will supervise a safe handing over of children to their parents/carers.
- If you have several children who need to be collected from different gates, please contact the school
 office and Libby will try to organise it so that you can collect your children from the same gate and at
 the same time. If your children are already in school and arrangements have already been made, you
 do not need to contact the school office to rearrange.
- Outside of school, there are markings on the pavements to help support social/physical distancing. I ask that you help us by following these rules when outside of school.

- If you are accessing school via Faunce Street gate, please do not drive down Faunce Street but instead walk as we have tried to pedestrianise the street to help with arrivals to and departures from school and to ensure these transitions are as safe as possible for everyone.
- If your child is in years 2-5 and is already in school, please check the school time and gate information below carefully as these details may have changed.
- I ask that you are patient with us as we are trying our best to ensure that we keep children and our families as safe as we possibly can while expanding our numbers to more of our community.

All children will be taught by a teacher. In most cases, children will be taught by their class teacher but be aware that there are a few exceptions. Without doing this, we would have had to say no to some children returning to school so I appreciate your understanding on this matter.

Children have had hot meals for the last few weeks and we have made the decision to continue with this. We will continue to review this as feeding nearly 200 children while enforcing the government guidelines has meant a lot of organising. Your child/children can of course bring a packed lunch but please remember that these should be taken home and cleaned each day.

We encourage children to wear school uniform where possible, but clean clothes each day are more important so children are permitted to wear clothes that they would usually only wear at home.
