Tutorial Day

Children had a great time today dressing up in number related outfits and completing maths puzzles. Look out for the photos in next week's newsletter. We have raised well over £200 for the NSPCC so far, thank you for your generous donations! If you would still like to donate there is a collection bucket in the office.

Trading Cards

We lifted the ban on trading cards in school for a number of reasons and we still feel that there are many benefits to allowing children to bring them in to school. They provide additional social opportunities for children, they are good for developing maths skills such as problem solving and strategic thinking and school is one of the only places that most children get the chance to swap and play with cards with their friends.

However, following some issues in school since the ban was lifted we will be making some changes to the rules around them. From Monday children will not be allowed to bring their card folders or large tins into school, they will only be allowed to bring in a small number of cards (their 'spares' for trading) that can fit in their pocket or can be stored in their classroom tray if they have one. As well as making it less likely that cards will go missing, this will also partially address the issues of inequality raised by some children having greater access to cards than others. There will be specific trading zones in each playground and cards will only be allowed to be used in these areas. This will allow adults on duty to provide better supervision and address any problems that arise.

Scratch Competition



Children enjoy using the program *Scratch* to create their own animations and games. In school, children use the program from Year 1, to develop skills in programming and continue using it throughout their time at Bessemer, learning more about how to use the more advanced blocks in their own projects.

The wonderful thing about Scratch and Scratch Junior (for younger children) is the app is free to download to use at home to create your own projects. There is also a fantastic online version, where the Scratch community can share, play and comment on each other's projects in a positive and constructive way.

If you haven't yet checked out this resource, then please consider it. It can be a great way to engage with your child about things they enjoy doing and find out what they have been learning in school. <u>https://scratch.mit.edu/</u>

On Monday you will receive a letter about a Scratch competition that we are running in school with our computing ambassadors, so you might want to get practising!






Some KS2 children took part in a PSSRN bowling competition this week. They had a great time and demonstrated brilliant teamwork.

In a still overwhelmingly a male dominated industry, the art world still has some way to go achieve anything close to equal representation for their female counterparts. According to a study conducted by the National Museum of Women in the Arts only **13.7% of living artists represented by galleries in Europe and North America are women** (source) However in the UK, **73% of students on postgraduate art and design courses are women** according to a study by Dr Kate McMillan for the Freedom Foundation (source).
