How do you do?

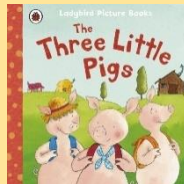
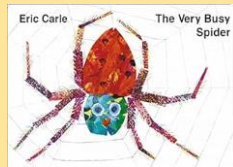
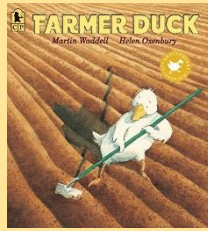
Second little pig, second little pig,

## Key Vocabulary

## Listening & Attention - Rhyming

This week we have been making lots of silly soup. We have been putting lots of objects that rhyme into our rhyming soup and making rhyming strings.

### Home Challenge!

Play Silly Soup with your child! Use a bowl and spoon as props to act out the song. Invite your child, in turn, to choose a rhyming object (e.g. cat, bat, fox, box etc) to put into the soup and place it in the bowl. After each turn, stir the soup and sing the following song to recite the growing list of things that end up in the soup. Sing the first part of the song to the tune of 'Pop Goes the Weasel':
