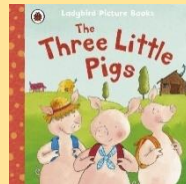
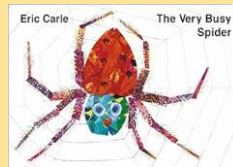
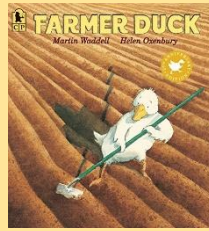

Key Vocabulary

Listening & Attention - Rhyming

This week we have been making rhyming pairs with objects and seeing if we can spot the objects that do not rhyme.

Home Challenge!

Ask your child to identify the 'odd one out': the name that does not rhyme. The children need to be familiar with the rhyming word families before they can use them in a game - spend time looking at the pictures and talking about the pairs.
