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Primary School Sport Premium at Bessemer Grange

At Bessemer Grange Primary School we aim to establish a sporting culture that enables and encourages all children to play and enjoy sport. We have established a number of after-school clubs for our pupils offering a wide variety of sporting opportunities for our children. We enter numerous school sport competitions to allow children to be competitive and are constantly developing our PE programme.

How will we be spending the Sports funding and who will benefit?

The Sports funding will be used to:

- Join the London and P.E. School Sport Network. This network provides teacher training opportunities including New Curriculum training, as well as supplying P.E experts to work with teachers in delivering high quality P.E. lessons. The network also allows our school access to a full calendar of competitive and non-competitive (including gifted and talented and SEN) events for both KS1 and KS2.
- Increase the skill level of staff in the delivery of quality P.E. teaching.
- Buy exciting and stimulating resources to facilitate the teaching of PE.
- Extend after-school sports activities. We now offer a range of school clubs, accessed by children from Key Stages one and two. We have built capacity by employing sports coaches to work alongside our teachers.
- Develop a safe but active use of the playground at break times.
- Provide opportunities for children to compete. We feel it is important that children have the chance to represent their school and take part in competitive sport against other schools.

Impact

We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal selfevaluation and provision mapping arrangements. We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways. We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school. We will also evaluate the impact of professional development opportunities in improving teaching and learning in PE.
