It was safer internet day this week and all of the children learnt about keeping themselves safe while using the internet. Please can you continue this at home by talking to children about the ways in which they are allowed to use the internet, what they should do if they see something that makes them uncomfortable, and how they can try to avoid this by being careful what they search for, for example we have been told that some children are talking about having seen upsetting videos entitled 'Huggy Wuggy', which initially sound child-friendly, but are quite frightening.

A Message from Dulwich Street Space

Dulwich Streetspace Review update - February 2022

Last year we worked with the Dulwich community and our stakeholders, listening to suggestions on how we can improve the experimental Dulwich Streetspace measures to ensure they work for the whole community. Whilst opinions varied on the changes, the process was comprehensive. Thank you for your contribution to that process.

Alignment with school streets - We will continue to align the timed restrictions with the principles of school streets and active travel to local schools. We encourage you to use active travel such as walking, cycling and public transport for your school journey.

What is new?

The council confirms that traffic orders for the changes were made on 10 February, 2022: These orders will come into force on 17 February 2022.

The main changes and improvements

- **Timed Restrictions:** Hours of timed restrictions reduced from 5 hours to 2.5 hours (8.00 to 9.00am and 3.00pm to 4.30pm)
- Exemption for Southwark Blue Badge Holders (by application) and Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) Travel- <u>How can I apply</u>
- Improved Access for Emergency Services at Calton Avenue/Court Lane and Derwent Grove
- Improved Signage
