News and Reminders

World Book Day

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday 3rd March, when children will be invited to dress up as their favourite book character or anything relating to reading, with prizes for the most creative costumes. We will also have an author visit from Rachel Chivers Khoo who will be talking about her new book to children in Years 2-5.

We are extending World Book Day into a Book Week and have planned a range of reading themed activities to take place around World Book Day. F@B will be setting up a 'Pop Up Book Shop' where all children will be able to choose a book to take home free of charge. 







Mental Health Week
