### **Black History Month**

While we ensure that Black History is embedded in our topics throughout the year we are also celebrating Black History Month this month.

Classes across the school are spending this month researching Black British artists, musicians, sports people and other heroes, as well as events such as Notting Hill Carnival and the history of The Windrush. They will be putting together large pieces of work which we plan to frame to create a Black History gallery which you will be able to visit the next time you are in school.

In assembly this week Key Stage Two children thought about how Rosa Parks used her voice to demand change when she saw that something wasn't right, and were encouraged to use their own voices to speak up for change whenever they see unfairness and discrimination.

Our catering company has planned a special 'festival menu' for children who have school lunches to celebrate Black History Month. This will be served next Thursday instead of the planned menu options for that day (although jacket potatoes will still be available as well).
