Sports Days

National Windrush Day

Next week, June 22nd will mark the 75th Anniversary of The Empire Windrush docking in Tilbury in 1948. We will be learning more about this throughout the week, using both historical sources and interviews to explore first hand experiences of those who came to Britain during that time and explore the amazing contributions made by those who have migrated. Children will learn about the challenges faced by those came to the UK to help rebuild the country after the Second World War. KS1 children will explore the history of Windrush through the text 'Windrush Child' by John Agard. On Monday KS2 children will attend a live online talk by Baroness Floella Benjamin about her experiences of what it was like to come to Britain during that time.

School Trips

As you know, at Bessemer we enrich our creative and practical curriculum with trips, visits and workshops throughout the year. Whenever possible we find trips and other opportunities that we can offer free of charge and we try very hard to keep the cost of other experiences as low as we can, often with help from F@B who kindly subsidise some of the more expensive trips. However, our limited budget means that we still need parents and carers to make contributions to cover their child's place in order for trips and other experiences to take place. For this reason, and to make managing payments easier for our admin staff, we really need everyone who is able to set up a Parentmail account to make these payments. Of course, we would never allow a child to miss an experience because their family were unable to fund it, but we do ask that if you are unable to meet the cost of a trip that you let the office staff know in confidence, so that we can decide whether or not the trip can go ahead based on the donations received.

Medication

Please remember that children should not have any medication with them in school. <u>All</u> medication, including hay fever tablets, must be taken to the school office and a medication form completed before it can be given.




Sharing Children's Learning

Year 6 have begun work on their Enterprise project - using a £5 budget to make a product to sell to the school community in a few weeks' time (the date will be shared in the newsletter soon!). The children are highly motivated as they know that any profits they make will go towards their end of year party!

They want to thank all the wonderful parents and carers who took the time to complete their survey last week, which has been really helpful in guiding what they have chosen to make. The children have been hard at work using lots of their maths skills: calculating how much of their ingredients they can afford, using their understanding of ratios to scale the recipe and interpreting graphs. They are also getting to work on their IT skills: making PowerPoint presentations, researching recipes and prices on the Internet, creating spreadsheets and surveys using Google Forms. In the coming weeks we will be visiting Sainsburys to buy ingredients and make their products.
