News and Reminders

Industrial Action Update

As you know, school will be closed for children on February 1st due to the teachers' strike. We will however be open between 12 and 1pm during which time all children can come to school to eat a cooked lunch if they wish and again for After School Club between 3.30 and 5.45pm. The lunchtime and After School Club staff are not involved in the strike and these periods can be safely staffed without teachers.

After School Club can be booked and paid for as usual on Parentmail, where it will be listed as *After school Club, Industrial Action*. All existing After School Club (and Breakfast Club) bookings for February 1st will be cancelled and refunded, so you will need to rebook if your child was already booked in for February 1st and you still wish for them to attend.

Lunchtime attendance will also be added to Parentmail, as *Lunch, Industrial Action,* there will not be a charge for attending but we need an indication of numbers to inform our catering staff.

Bookings for After School Club, Industrial Action and Lunch, Industrial Action are now open on Parentmail and will close again at 12 noon on Friday 27th January.

Once we know how many children will be coming for lunch we will update you with information about drop off and pick up points. If you would like your KS2 child to walk home alone after lunch they will be allowed to do so as long as they have permission for going home alone on ordinary school days. If your child does not have permission to walk home alone but you would like them to do so on this occasion please email the school office. Children in KS1 can not walk home alone and must be collected by an adult.

Open House Coffee Morning

Nature Garden Sessions

During the winter the nature garden can become quite muddy. Classes still make use of their sessions unless the weather is really wet, so please send your child with a waterproof coat (and waterproof trousers if you wish) and either wellies or spare shoes if possible. If you are unable to send spares, please do make sure that your child is not wearing shoes that you do not want to get muddy on their nature garden day.

Cold Weather

While the weather is cold, please try to send your child to school with gloves and perhaps a hat and scarf as they are outside for up to an hour at a time during the school day. Please make sure that all items are clearly named.

P.E. Kit

P.E. kit consists of navy (or black or grey if you do not have navy) tracksuit bottoms, leggings or shorts with either a gem house t-shirt or a white polo t-shirt and trainers. All P.E. kit items should be plain, not patterned, and children should not be wearing football kits as P.E. kit. If the weather is cold children can wear their usual school jumper over their P.E. kit. Children in upper KS2 should have a spare t-shirt in school on P.E. days in case they need to change after their P.E. lesson.

Sharing Children's Learning

Last term Year 5's music lessons focused on singing, led by our music teacher Duncan. On Monday the children went to the O2 arena to take part in the Young Voices choir performance. 9000 children took part in the performance, supported by dancers, musicians, singers and other performers. 
