### Industrial Action - School Closure

Parents and carers are invited to join us for the whole day, or as much of it as possible. Please try to come for lunch and bring a picnic to share with your child on the field. If you are not able to do so, please either provide your child with a packed lunch, or order a school packed lunch on Parentmail, selecting either a cheese or tuna sandwich. If you are providing lunch for your child, either by joining them for a picnic or sending a packed lunch from home, please indicate this on Parentmail by selecting 'home lunch' so that we do not order unnecessary school lunches.

All children should wear P.E. kit to school on their sports day. This should include trainers and navy shorts, tracksuit bottoms or leggings depending on the weather (black or grey please if you don't have navy). Children will be competing in their houses on sports day (KS1 and KS2) so should wear either a school house t-shirt or a t-shirt in their house colour. Children in Early Years can wear their usual school t-shirts.

Children will be on the field all day so must have a water bottle with them as well as a hat and sun cream if the weather is hot.

### **National Windrush Day**

In the newsletter two weeks ago we told you about National Windrush Day, the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the docking of The Empire Windsrush in Tilbury, England. Last week, children completed activities commemorating the Anniversary of the Empire Windrush. On Monday, the whole of KS2 had a live online talk from the author, actress, politician *and* Windrush passenger Baroness Floella Benjamin, run by the National Archives. She shared both her positive and negative experiences of 'Coming to England'. Children then completed a range of activities in classes. Please see some of our learning below:





Children in Key Stage One studied the poem Windrush Child by John Agard and practiced reciting it themselves.







After listening to Baroness Benjamin's talk, children looked at the passenger list from The Empire Windrush and learnt about some of the passengers.

Children in Year 6 went to Southwark Park to compete in an athletics competition against other schools this week. Everyone had a great time, the children's sporting behaviour was excellent and Bessemer finished in third place. Well done Year 6!









Children in 5LW had their Junior Roadwatch session this week. They explored a police vehicle and some equipment and then used some of the equipment themselves to identify motorists breaking the speed limit in the local area. These sessions have been really useful in helping children understand the role of the police as well as the dangers of not following the speed limit when driving.

Children in Nursery have had an exciting week! First they had a visit from firefighters who brought their engine along and children had a great time sitting in the engine and trying out the sirens and hoses:






