News and Reminders

Home Reading

As you know, we have had a particular focus on reading this year. As part of this, every child who is below expected levels in reading has had a 1:1 reading session with an adult nearly every day throughout the year. Our data shows that this is one of the most successful interventions that we have ever run as these children have made excellent progress in reading this year.

Of course, the best progress has been made by the children in this group who have daily reading sessions at home as well as in school, which is why home reading remains so important. Daily reading at home also ensures great progress for children who are on track or above in reading so are not part of the school's daily readers' programme. Thank you to everyone who has contributed to this progress by facilitating regular home reading!

Please make sure that you listen to your child read every day. For younger children and early readers this will mean listening to them read their school reading book and helping them to apply their phonic knowledge and other strategies as well as asking questions to check their understanding of what they have read. There are suggestions for supporting reading and comprehension skills in the back of the school reading scheme books. For more confident readers this will include asking them to read parts of their chosen book out loud so that you can check for fluency, accuracy and expression, but also asking them questions about what they have read when they have been reading by themselves.

Please keep up with daily reading during school holidays and weekends so that we can continue to ensure the best possible progress for our children. When your child reads at home, please sign their reading diary as this enables them to collect their reading stickers and certificates as rewards.

Packed Lunches

Please remember that we are a Healthy School. This means that we expect children's packed lunches to meet our Healthy School standards. Children are not allowed crisps, cake, sweet (chocolate/sugar covered) biscuits, chocolate bars, sweets or drinks other than water in their packed lunches and will not be allowed to eat these items in school if they do bring them.

On school trips packed lunches are considered more of a treat, so the rules are more relaxed, but children are still not allowed to bring sweets, large chocolate bars (biscuits with some chocolate on are acceptable) or fizzy drinks, and packed lunches should still contain healthy items as well as treats. If children bring sweets to school or on trips they will be confiscated and will not be returned unless an adult comes to school to collect them. For health and safety reasons, no packed lunches can contain nuts or nut products or uncut grapes.
