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Public Health England - Measles

We are seeing much higher than normal levels of measles in London this year, including in Southwark schools. Measles spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools, and is a nasty illness and in some children can be very serious and lead to hospitalisation - and in rare cases tragically can cause death. People in certain at-risk groups including babies and young children, pregnant women, and people with weakened immunity, are at increased risk of complications if they catch measles. Below provides information about the symptoms of measles:

NHS - measles

Measles was eliminated in the UK in 2017, due to the success of the MMR vaccination programme, but falling vaccination uptake since then has meant that it has come back. MMR vaccination is very effective at preventing measles, and is extremely safe. It is given in two doses, one at 12 months, and one at 18 months. A version of the MMR vaccine that does not contain pork gelatine is available on request from all GPs. If you or your child have not had all your MMR vaccines please contact your GP today to book an appointment. Below provides further information about the vaccine:
