

## IntoUniversity at Keyworth

Academic attainment is a crucial factor in determining the options available to young people when they leave school.



Young people growing up in Britain's least privileged neighbourhoods have always faced an uphill struggle. Homes are often overcrowded spaces where young people have nowhere to study, where devices are shared between siblings, and where hard-pressed families do not have spare cash for tutors and after-school activities. Few get the grades to go to university.

As a result, many families are caught in a vicious cycle, where the disadvantages of one generation are passed onto the next. This creates neighbourhoods where for decades, poverty and educational underachievement have gone hand in hand.

Keyworth is very fortunate to host IntoUniversity Kennington on our site. IntoUniversity Kennington works with the children in two ways:

- Their FOCUS programme, which takes place throughout the school year, provides information, advice and guidance for all children in KS2 through their immersive workshops, with the aim of inspiring the children to be academically ambitious for their future goals;
- Their Academic Support programme offers FREE tutoring support after school for children in KS2, with the aim of supporting the children to become active, curious and independent learners.

All children in KS2 at Keyworth will take part in the FOCUS programme. Should you wish your child in KS2 to attend the


