#### Year 3 history

Children in year 3 were comparing the home dwellings found in the Stone Age with the Iron Age. They discussed how the dwellings were similar and different, as well as identifying the reasons for these changes.

They discussed how fossils are used as evidence that species from the past existed. They then created their own ammonite fossils using salt dough, string and their fingers to add detail of the ancient fossil's shell.
