Year 6 SATs

Congratulations to our year 6 children (and staff) who this week received fantastic SATs results. We are extremely proud of the effort that the children put into their learning and the way that they have managed so well having missed so much in-school teaching during the last few years.

I must, however, point out that it is not all about doing well at SATs and children 'passing or failing' them. SATs are a means of judging and comparing schools, despite all schools being very different and facing different challenges. Whether our children 'passed or failed' using these SATs measures, we want all children to know that their best is enough and there are many areas other than SATs that they have been successful in.

At Keyworth, we are very proud to be fully inclusive, believing that all children deserve the best standard of education and school experience no matter their differences. We have a

significantly above national average number of children with English as an Additional Language, a significantly above national average of children with Special Educational Needs and a significantly above national average of children who receive free-school meals. This does not phase us and our message continues to be... "all children are welcome".

Message for current Reception parents - "stay and play"

Dear Parents and Carers,

You and your child are invited to our stay and play session for children entering year one in September. It will be on Wednesday 13th July in the year one classrooms.

It will begin with parents and carers at 3:00pm for a quick informal meeting in the community room about year one while the children are still in class. This will give you the opportunity to find out more about our year one provision, things to expect in the coming year and for you to discuss any questions or concerns you have about your child's transition.

After the brief meeting you will then be able to collect your child from reception and bring them over to the year one classrooms. The stay and play session will then begin at 3:45pm and end at around 4:15pm.

This is a chance for your child to play in the year one setting. Accompanied by an adult or parent, children will get the opportunity to come into school at the end of the day and play in year one for half an hour. Parents have the opportunity to talk to the teachers and other parents whilst the children get to know the setting.

We look forward to welcoming you and your child into the year one provision very soon.

To ensure classes are as balanced as possible in terms of needs, we have mixed many year groups for next year. Keyworth has high mobility rates, meaning that lots of children arrive and depart the school, which impacts the make-up of each class. For your reference, since the start of this academic year, Keyworth has had 51 children join the school and 19 children leave (part way through the year).


Please note that after the carnival the children will return briefly to class before being dismissed in the usual way (you can take your child/ren home as soon as the staff are ready to dismiss them).

AUTISM PUBERTY,
SEXUAL WELLBEING
AND RELATIONSHIPS

For parents of a child on the autistic spectrum, coping with the onset of puberty and their child's emerging sexuality can be challenging. Knowing what to teach, how/when to teach it and what to expect can be daunting.

These three sessions have a different delivery style to the Cygnet core programme. Because of the nature of the subject matter it was felt that a far more activity-based approach would put parents at ease more quickly and therefore enhance learning and mutual support.
