

the table, some classes have very poor attendance and this needs to improve next term.

Thank you to all parents/carers who have high expectations of their children's attendance and punctuality to school.

The main reasons for poor attendance this term are:

- 1. The persistent absence of some children (below 90%);
- 2. Sickness, but particularly when children are off for 3+ days at a time;
- 3. Unauthorised term-time holidays.

As a reminder, the school monitors all children's attendance regularly and parents/carers will be contacted should a child's attendance fall below 90%. Initially, this will be at an informal stage but with a view to reporting to the local authority should attendance continue to be unacceptable.

# <u>Free school meal vouchers - Christmas</u> holiday

Southwark remains committed to supporting its disadvantaged pupils during the Christmas holiday 2022 and will do this



by using part of the *Household Support Fund* to fund meals for those pupils who are eligible to receive *benefits-related free school meals*. Children who meet these requirements will receive £33 worth of food vouchers per child for the duration of the holiday.

If your child has previously not been entitled to receive benefits-related free school meals and your financial circumstances have changed in the past year, please complete the entitlement form that can be collected from the school office.

## Letter reminder - Public Health Southwark

# PUBLIC HEALTH UPDATE FOR SOUTHWARK PARENTS/CARERS

Below is a message from *Public Health Southwark* that we have been asked to share with you:

#### **SCARLET FEVER: BE AWARE OF THE SYMPTOMS**

**Scarlet fever** is caused by a bacteria called *Group A Streptococcus* and cases are higher than we would typically see at this time of year. The first signs of scarlet fever can be flu-like symptoms, including a high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands. A sandpaper like rash appears 12 to 48 hours later.

You should contact NHS 111 or your GP if you suspect your child has scarlet fever.

*Group A Streptococcus* can also cause other respiratory and skin infections and, in very rare occasions, the bacteria can get into the bloodstream and cause an illness called invasive *Group A strep (iGAS)*. While uncommon, there has been an increase in iGAS cases this year, particularly in children under 10.

If your child seems unwell, please contact NHS 111 or your GP.

NHS 111 or your GP should be contacted if a child has scarlet fever, as early treatment with antibiotics will reduce the risk of complications. As per national guidance, children and adults with suspected scarlet fever should be excluded from nursery / school / work for 24 hours after the commencement of appropriate antibiotic treatment. Good hand and respiratory hygiene are important for stopping the spread of infection.
