



Latest News

Attendance and punctuality

As you will know, children's attendance and punctuality to school has a direct impact on their academic performance, social skills, friendships, life skills, future prospects and general wellbeing. The aim is for all children to attend school at least 95% of the time. Thank you to all families whose children come to school regularly and on time.

If your child is persistently absent from school (attendance below 90%), the school will be contacting you to discuss this. Should your child's attendance not improve when we review attendance again next term, we may have to make a referral to Southwark's Attendance Team.

An attendance rate of 90% might sound quite good but would mean that a child is absent for 4 weeks in the school year. If this rate remained the same throughout the years a child is legally expected to attend school, then he/she would miss more than one year of their education.

If your child arrives late to school and after the register is taken, this will be included in your child's overall attendance percentage and be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

Managing children's attendance and punctuality is a massive job for all schools, so I would appreciate all families support in working with the school in order that all children can achieve their very best and improve their future prospects.

Morning gates

As a reminder, parents/carers should drop their child/ren off at the gates in the morning and not cut through the school. Please ensure that you leave your home in good time so that your child/ren is/are punctual to school.

Only a few families whose children have SEND and are in KS1 or KS2 have been given permission to take their child/ren to the playground.

If your child is in Nursery or Reception, you are strongly advised to drop them off at Gaza Street gate unless a sibling is taking

them through to their class.

Online safety

As a school, we are passionate about raising awareness of online safety. It is really important that we all take responsibility for safeguarding children. We are fully aware that many children use online gaming and social media platforms for pleasure, but may not be fully aware of the appropriacy of content and/or whether it is age-appropriate. Jewellery

Children should not be wearing any jewellery (other than stud or small sleeper earrings) to school unless it is essential for religious reasons. This is because jewellery can get caught or pulled while children are playing which can be dangerous to children or can damage the jewellery. Children cannot take part in PE while wearing jewellery and items are often lost when removed for PE, so please leave all jewellery at home.




Anti-Bullying Week

Bullying is described by the Anti-Bullying Alliance as, "The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face-to-face or online".

Sometimes the word "bullying" is used incorrectly when describing a disagreement between children in school. Keyworth takes all incidents of bullying extremely seriously. Most children have moments where they are unkind to others - the differences between being unkind to someone and bullying someone need to be clear when managing disagreements.
