

# Latest News

## <u>Year 6 SATs</u>

This week the children in year 6 completed their KS2 SATs and we are extremely proud of their efforts. I have been with the children all week and I will say that, despite many of the questions being challenging, the children performed to their best. One of Keyworth's values is to be **academically ambitious**. Being academically ambitious means that "we strive to exceed in academic attainment across all areas of the curriculum".

SATs do not show whether someone has a talent in art, or science, or geography, or music, or sport. SATs do not show the progress that a child has made and what a "pass" means to them. SATs do not show the obstacles a child may face, whether English is their second language, whether they have recently arrived into the country, or whether they have an additional learning need.

SATs do not show whether a child is self-aware and supportive, whether they are creative and practical, whether they are respectful of others, whether they are connected to their community or whether their views and actions are progressive.

Keyworth is a proudly diverse and inclusive school where our pupils and staff have a strong sense of belonging, can be their true selves and know they can achieve anything with focus and effort. While SATs are used as a benchmark by the government to ensure standards are high, there are other measures by which to judge children's successes. All children are and will continue to be welcome at our school no matter what.


# Year 4 multiplication check

- Exercising every morning for 15 minutes at school;


- A two-mile walk to Vauxhall.




## Lance Corporal Leonard Keyworth

In school we have been learning about the importance of heritage. In 1951 the school, formerly known as Faunce Street School, was renamed Keyworth Primary School. The school was renamed Keyworth Primary School after Lance Corporal Leonard Keyworth... but who was he?

Leonard James Keyworth was born on 12<sup>th</sup> August 1893 in Lincoln and worked in engineering and insurance before the outbreak of the First World War in 1914. Leonard tried to enlist (join) the Lincolnshire Regiment at the outbreak of the war but was rejected. Instead, he travelled to London and joined the 24<sup>th</sup> London Regiment on 16<sup>th</sup> September 1914.

On the night of 25th May 1915, the men of the 24th London Regiment had made a successful assault on a German position near Givenchy in Northern France. Putting himself in serious danger, Leonard Keyworth defended the trenches and returned home as a war hero.



After his exploits at Givenchy, Keyworth was granted a lengthy

period of leave and on 12th July 1915 he was presented with the Victoria Cross by King George V at Buckingham Palace. The Victoria Cross (VC) is the highest and most prestigious award of the British honours system. It is awarded for courage/bravery to members of the British Armed Forces.

Leonard Keyworth's bravery made local and national headlines. During the next few weeks, Leonard attended many events to celebrate his heroism but soon asked to return to his regiment. Tragically, he did not live to enjoy his new-found fame for long, as he received severe head wounds at Abbeville on 19th October 1915 and subsequently died of his injuries.

A few days after Keyworth's death, Lieutenant-Colonel John Eustace Jameson, wrote a letter to his mother in which he paid tribute to her son's heroism: "Your son, our comrade, was one of the highest examples of unselfishness and devotion to his comrades and to duty. His name will be enrolled among the bravest of the brave."

Leonard Keyworth was buried in Abbeville Communal Cemetery in France and has his name inscribed in several memorials in Lincoln. He also has two streets in Southwark named after him as well as our school changing its name to Keyworth Primary School in 1951 in memory of him.
