

Latest News

Anti-Bullying Week

Next week, schools throughout the UK will be taking part in Anti-Bullying Week around the theme of 'One Kind Word'. In school we will be having a whole school assembly to remind everyone of what bullying is and what action should take place if you feel that you are being bullied and/or witness bullying, as well as undertaking class discussions.

As a parent/carer, you are a vital piece of the puzzle in tackling bullying. You have a unique role to play in guiding and supporting your child/ren through their school years and there are lots of positive steps you can take to help keep your child/ren safe from bullying and harm. Below is a toolkit to give you information about bullying, tips about what to do if you are worried about bullying and the tools to help you talk to your child/ren about bullying.

When thinking about bullying, it is important to clarify the definition of it as children (and adults) may fall out often and/or say or do unkind things to each other in the heat of the moment - this does not necessarily mean that someone is being bullied but instead managing positive relationships needs to be a target to work on.


The Anti-Bullying Alliance defines bullying as: the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power.

Put simply this means any situation where your child is being deliberately and repeatedly hurt by other people and they find it hard to defend themselves. This could be face to face or online, in school or in the community. It may be physical, or it could be verbal or emotional. For example, your child might be pushed around by others, called names, or be excluded from friendship groups.

On Monday 15th November, the children are encouraged to wear odd socks to school to celebrate what makes us all unique.

Friday 19th November is BBC Children in Need day. Children can come to school wearing spots/stripes with a voluntary donation of £1.00 being requested. All money raised will be donated to the BBC Children in Need appeal.
