World Religion Day

At Keyworth, as part of our core values we teach the children about how to be respectful of others and progressive in our views. In order that we are respectful and progressive, it is important that we learn about the commonalities and differences between individuals within our community.

<u>Respectful</u>

We are respectful of each other's ideas, beliefs, backgrounds and practices.

We are considerate of the cultural identity and norms of the students and families we serve. Diversity, equality and inclusion are of great importance to us. We strive to support and educate children and adults to be sensitive to and respectful of diversity and put this into action through a socially aware curriculum and inclusive activities.

Progressive

We can be the change we want to see around us.

We nurture strong ethical values, integrity and a sense of social justice in our school community and teaching. We want our pupils to become independent thinkers, respectfully questioning convention, challenging inequality and finding their place as considerate individuals who will make a meaningful contribution to society.

Next week during our whole school assembly, the children will be listening to stories from different faiths. In class, they will learn about different religious themes:

Year group	Theme

Year 2	Christianity: stories of Jesus
Year 3	Sikhism: the story of Sikhism
Year 4	Buddhism and symbols
Year 5	Hinduism: right and wrong in Hinduism
Year 6	Judaism: what does it mean to be a religious leader?
