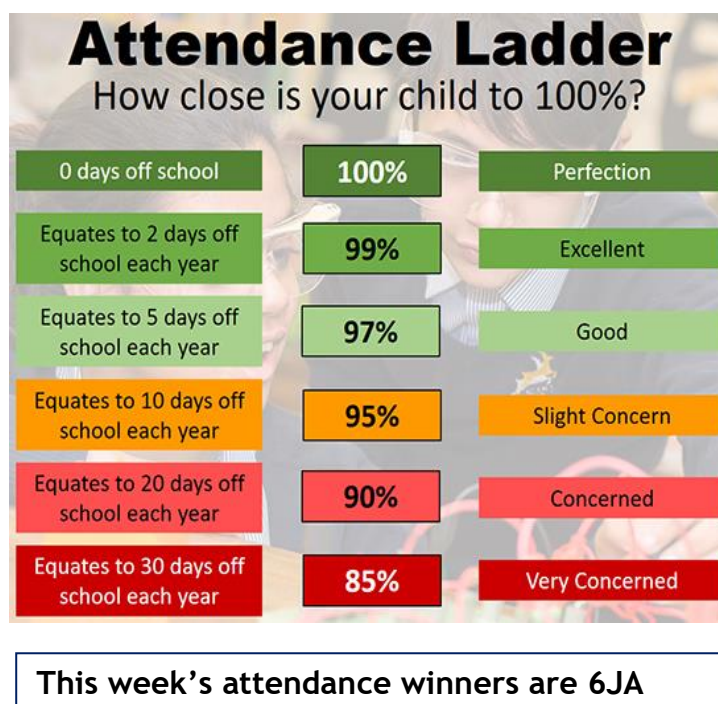

Latest News

Ofsted - attendance and punctuality

Keyworth last received an Ofsted inspection approximately 4 years ago, so is due. The school has changed dramatically for the better since then with the standards in teaching and learning, as well as behaviour significantly improving.

One area that is still a cause for concern for the school is the attendance and punctuality of the children, with the school falling below the expectations in relation to what "Outstanding" attendance and punctuality looks like. This will be picked up on by any inspector and will likely mean that we will not be able to aspire to achieve the grade that we would hope for and one that reflects what actually happens in the school. Please support your child/ren's school by ensuring that your child/ren attend/s Keyworth every day and on time, unless absolutely necessary - Keyworth is a community school and we all need to work together to ensure that the children have the best possible outcomes.

KS1 and KS2 SATs

This week, the children in year 6 completed their SATs. Children in year 2 have also been completing their SATs and will continue to do so during the next few weeks. At Keyworth, we believe in high standards and a consistency of quality education being provided throughout the school. The staff are really proud of the children of Keyworth and I want to repeat what I wrote last week... the children's best is enough.

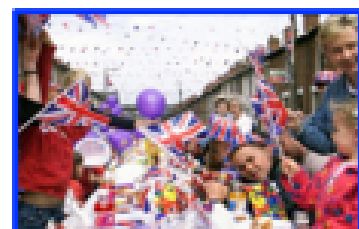

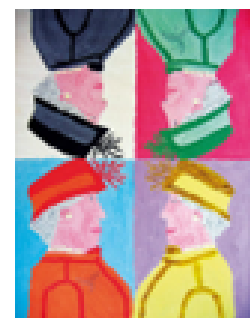
