Please see on the map below the route. The children will return through Gaza Street and go into the new building hall to get into position for their singing performance to parents and carers.


As the children go into the hall, parents and carers will be guided into the playground to get into position to watch your children perform.

#### **KS2 SATs**

This week, the children in year 6 received their SATs results with Keyworth performing extremely well in all areas; we are so proud of all of the children for putting in their best efforts.

One of Keyworth's values is to be **academically ambitious**. Being academically ambitious means that "we strive to exceed in academic attainment across all areas of the curriculum".

SATs do not show whether someone has a talent in art, or science, or geography, or music, or sport. SATs do not show the progress that a child has made and what a "pass" means to them. SATs do not show the obstacles a child may face, whether English is their second language, whether they have recently arrived into the country, or whether they have an additional learning need.


SATs do not show whether a child is self-aware and supportive, whether they are creative and practical, whether they are respectful of others, whether they are connected to their community or whether their views and actions are progressive.

Keyworth is a proudly diverse and inclusive school where our pupils and staff have a strong sense of belonging, can be their true selves and know they can achieve anything with focus and effort. While SATs are used as a benchmark by the government to ensure standards are high, there are other measures by which to judge children's successes. All children are and will continue to be welcome at our school no matter what.

#### Free school meals - message from Sadiq Khan

Below is a letter we received from Sadiq Khan about the roll-out of universal free school meals throughout London. If your personal circumstances have changed and you think that your child/ren may be entitled to receive free school meals, then please contact the school office.

## Dear Parent/Carer,

I'm delighted to inform you that City Hall is ensuring all primary school children who attend state schools in London will receive free school meals for the full academic year, starting this September.

As Mayor of London, I know parents/carers are really struggling with the cost-of-living crisis right now. That's why I've taken the decision to provide funding to expand on the Government's limited existing free school meals offer. This means all state funded primary school children in London are now eligible for free school meals.

Your borough has been doing wonderful work to deliver universal free school meals for primary school children already and I'm delighted to be able to provide them with the funding to do this for the next year. The funding we're providing will help up to 270,000 primary school children in London, like yours, access free school meals and could save your family upwards of £440 across the year.

Your child will receive their free school meals automatically, but it's vitally important that you still complete your school or borough's registration form in case your child is eligible for extra funding for their school from the Government, worth £1,300 per year. That's extra money to spend on enrichment activities, teacher development, and targeted support for the children that need it most. Depending on how schemes operate in your borough, it may also entitle you to other benefits like food vouchers during the holidays. There is more information about registration in your borough here:

Those parents/carers whose children already qualify for free school meals under the Government's existing offer must also continue to apply for free school meals as before.


#### PE and Schools Sports Network Awards
