

Free school meal vouchers - October half-term

Southwark remains committed to supporting its disadvantaged pupils during the October half term 2022 and will do this by using part of the Household Support Fund to fund meals for those pupils who are eligible to receive *benefits-related free school meals*. Children who meet these requirements will receive £15 food vouchers per child for the half-term.
