



Latest News

Hot weather

- Please ensure that your child has a water bottle labelled with their name. Staff have been informed to provide children with opportunities to drink water regularly throughout the day. During lunch, jugs of water are provided and replenished throughout service. If your child should forget their water bottle on any given day, we have multi-duty water fountains that can be used to drink from;
- Children do not need to wear their jumpers/cardigans to school. Children can wear shorts but these need to be plain;
- School staff cannot apply sunscreen to children. Please ensure that it is applied before your child/ren come to school. Children can bring sunscreen to school but they will need to be able to apply it themselves;



- School expectations around physical activity will be reduced and shade will be encouraged, as necessary;
- > Sun hats are strongly encouraged;
- Children should have footwear that is appropriate for all elements of school life and that is secure. Flip flops/sliders are not allowed for safety reasons;
- Children can wear sunglasses when outside to protect their eyes. However, if partaking in sporting activities where this may be unsafe, then they should not wear them e.g. when playing football.

We can be the change we want to see around us.


We nurture strong ethical values, integrity and a sense of social justice in our school community and teaching. We want our pupils to become independent thinkers, respectfully questioning convention, challenging inequality and finding their place as considerate individuals who will make a meaningful contribution to society.

It is 75 years since the HMT Empire Windrush docked in Tilbury, Essex, on 22 June 1948.

The ship brought 492 passengers to the UK from a number of Caribbean islands including

Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago, to help fill post-war labour shortages. In 2018 it emerged that the government had not properly recorded the details of the people who had been granted permission to stay in the UK and many were wrongly deported.

The term refers to people who arrived in the UK from Caribbean countries between 1948 and 1971, when British immigration laws changed. Although not all Windrush generation migrants arrived on



HMT Empire Windrush itself, the ship became a symbol of the wider mass-migration movement.

Many of those who came to the UK had served in the British armed forces in World War Two.

They became manual workers, cleaners, drivers and nurses in the newly established NHS - and some broke new ground in representing black Britons in society.
