Changes to reporting accidents/injuries in school

Head injuries

- If a child sustains a non-serious, accidental head bump in school we will send a text message rather than calling parents/carers. The purpose of the message is to make parents/carers aware that the accident has happened in the very unlikely event that complications such as concussion develop.
- If the child's head bump is more serious, we will call to speak to parents/carers directly. If we are unable to contact them, we will either leave a message or send a text. We will also contact parents/carers by phone rather than text if the injury occurred in a way that requires a more detailed explanation than a simple playground fall or bump, e.g. the child was intentionally hurt by another child.

Accident Slips

- > Children are now going to receive accident slips for all injuries requiring first aid.
- Blue slips will be written by the member of staff dealing with the child and will be sent home to inform parents/carers.
