

Keyworth supporting local primary schools

The senior leadership team at Keyworth knows the impressive level of staffing talent that we have in school and are really appreciative of everyone's efforts in providing the highest standard of education to Keyworth children. We are frequently asked to support other schools in Southwark in order to share best practice so I thought that I would summarise some examples of this in order to make you aware:

- ➤ The Southwark Local Authority has asked us to support other local schools in year 1, our team will be welcoming visitors from other Southwark schools who will view our provision with the aim of making improvements to their own, as "the provision in year 1 at Keyworth is Outstanding". Additionally, we have been asked to deliver training to other schools as part of Southwark's professional development programme;
- ➤ Jaime has been supporting a local school in developing their Reception provision. As part of this support, teachers have visited Keyworth to view our teaching and learning, and Jaime has visited the school to support with planning and preparation;
- > Our year 6 teachers Josh and Javi supported a teacher from a local school who wanted to develop their planning, differentiation and the effectiveness of their marking. She said that "the behaviour for learning was amazing, the children had excellent stamina for writing and that Keyworth was a really lovely school with excellent facilities";
- > Sarah has recently supported a primary school with their recruitment of teachers;
- ➤ Kristin has previously provided SEND and safeguarding support to a local school as well as supporting the Southwark Local Authority.

Every child deserves the best standard of education and school experience, and we are only too happy to help others achieve this.

Keyworth's breakfast provision

Magic Breakfast is a charity that provides healthy school breakfasts to children at risk of hunger in disadvantaged areas of the UK. Keyworth receives FREE breakfast items to support the notion that children "should not be too hungry to learn". For your information, below details how we use Magic Breakfast to ensure children have a good start to the school day:

- > Our Breakfast Club starts from 8:00am, catering for children across the school.
- ➤ In Nursery and Reception, breakfast stations are set up each morning with children being able to self-choose if they want to have breakfast.
- ➤ For children in years 1 to 6, we have a bagel station in the playground. This is so that children do not have to face the possible embarrassment of saying that they are hungry and instead just take a bagel as part of the normal daily routine any child can take a bagel without any questions being asked.

School uniform

I have noticed that there are quite a few children who are not wearing Keyworth uniform and are instead coming to school casually dressed. I am sure that you will agree that we are not overly strict with our school uniform expectations, however it is important that children come to school wearing appropriate school clothing every day.
