

#### Latest News

#### Term time absence requests

We have been inundated with term time absence requests. Please note the following guidance provided by the Government around school attendance and the role of parents/carers:

#### The law on school attendance and right to a full-time education

10. The law entitles every child of compulsory school age to an efficient, full-time education suitable to their age, aptitude, and any special educational need they may have. It is the legal responsibility of every parent to make sure their child receives that education either by attendance at a school or by education otherwise than at a school.

11. Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional legal duty to ensure their child attends that school regularly. This means their child must attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school.

Regular attendance to school has a target of 96% in an academic year. When it comes to holidays in term time, the Government guidance states:

#### Holidays in term time

A holiday is generally not considered an exceptional circumstance. You cannot usually take your child away during term time.



You can be <u>fined or face legal action</u> for taking your child on holiday during term time.

If a family request an absence from school by using the "Request for Term Time Absence Form" on the school website, the School will consider each request on an individual basis. Absences from school will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances, where a child has excellent attendance to school and for a few days only.



#### Schools absence guidance

#### What are exceptional circumstances?

The Headteacher may only grant leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. Examples of any exceptional circumstances where leave may be granted during term time are as follows:

- If a parent is service personnel and is returning from a tour of duty abroad where it is evidenced the individual will not be in receipt of any leave in the near future that coincides with school holidays;
- Where an absence from school is recommended by a health professional as part of a parent or child's rehabilitation from a medical or emotional issue;
- The death or terminal illness of a close relative, only if Headteacher is satisfied that the circumstances are truly exceptional;
- Out of school programmes such as music, arts or sport operating at a high standard of achievement. Documentary evidence of this event will be required;
- To attend a wedding or funeral of a close relative if the Headteacher is satisfied that the circumstances are truly exceptional. Leave should only be authorised for this purpose when a Headteacher is satisfied that there is a persuasive reason for holding the wedding during term time and there WILL be an onus on parents to show clear evidence that this absence is absolutely an exceptional circumstance.

In difficult family situations the Headteacher may use his/her discretion in granting leave and each case should be addressed on its individual merits, considering the overall welfare of the child. Where there are exceptional and unforeseen circumstances that fall outside of the above, the Headteacher can agree to consult with the governing body prior to any authorisation being given to the parent. Evidence would be required in each case. If a request meets the above exceptional circumstances but falls within the following times, the Headteacher must be convinced that absence from school is the only option:

- 1) The first half term of any academic year (applies to all pupils).
- 2) Year six transition day (for pupils in year six).
- 3) Year six SATs week (for pupils in year six).

When considering exceptional term time leave requests, the following factors may help to reach a decision:

- > Time of the academic year when the leave has been requested;
- > Duration of the absence number of school days being missed;
- > The child's current attendance and punctuality rate;
- Exceptional Term time leave requested/taken in previous academic years for a similar purpose;
- Whether parent/carers have considered limiting the amount of time the child would be absent from school e.g. wrapping around school holiday;
- Have alternative care arrangements been considered by the parent/carer to limit the time away from school;
- Impact on any interventions, assessments or referrals being undertaken with the child or family e.g. family support, social care assessments, CAMHS, SEN;
- > The impact that the absence will have on the child;
- > Whether it falls within any key stage national tests or exams.

#### What is not exceptional?

Examples of circumstances NOT considered as exceptional:

- Holidays abroad for the purpose of visiting a sick relative, excepting where that person is seriously ill. Medical evidence may be requested;
- > Holidays taken in term time due to lower cost/parental work commitments.
