Free School Meal Holiday vouchers

As you should already be aware, Free School Meal holiday vouchers are now distributed directly through Southwark Council. You should receive your vouchers on Monday 23rd October by email.

How can voucher related enquiries be made?

There is a telephone number on the back of the vouchers, which takes parents through to the Southwark contact centre - the contact centre will log their enquiry and submit to the Cost of Living Team to resolve.

Flu vaccinations at Keyworth

Your child's annual flu vaccination is now due. This vaccination is recommended to help protect your child against flu. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable family and friends by preventing the spread of flu.

Please use the link provided to access the electronic consent form https://sav.hrch.nhs.uk/flu/2023/southwark.

Please complete one consent form for each child to ensure your child receives their vaccination. Our team will visit your school on Thursday 2nd November 2023. The deadline for submitting your e-consent form is 72 hours before the session excluding weekends.

Your child will be offered the live nasal flu spray or the injectable porcine free flu vaccine. The nasal spray vaccination is a quick and simple spray up the nose. Even if your child had the vaccine last year, it is recommended to have the flu vaccine again this year due to changes in flu strains circulating each year. The injectable porcine free vaccine is now available in school.

Since the programme was introduced, most children offered the vaccine in schools have had the immunisation. Please complete the consent form even if you decide you do not want to vaccinate your child against flu this year. Completion of the consent form is not mandatory if you do not want your child to be vaccinated. However, as providers of the school age vaccinations, NHSE requires that we provide numbers of parents that do not consent to their child being vaccinated. Therefore, we will only use this information to provide numbers of parents declining consent - no other details will be shared. If consent forms are not completed, you may be contacted by phone or text. If you have returned a no consent, we will not make any further contact this year.
