Latest News

Attendance

It is the law that all children attend school regularly and schools have a duty to not only monitor attendance but also work with families to ensure that children's learning is not affected by persistent absence. This week, some of you will have received a letter making you aware that your child's attendance is below 90% and is therefore deemed persistent - whether absence is authorised or unauthorised, it is all included when the school reviews a child's attendance and in the actions we take. Below I have summarised the process we follow for attendance:

A letter is sent to parents/carers to make them aware that their child's attendance is below 90% (persistent absence).

If a child's attendance improves within the next half-term meaning that they are no longer persistently absent (below 90%), their attendance will continue to be monitored but with no further action taken unless it falls again to below 90%.

If a child still has persistent absence, parents/carers may be contacted to attend an attendance panel meeting in school.

If a child's attendance improves within the next half-term meaning that they are no longer persistently absent (below 90%), their attendance will continue to be monitored but with no further action taken unless it falls again to below 90%.

If a child still has persistent absence, the school may need to make a referral to Southwark Council.

* The school will consider exceptional circumstances when monitoring attendance and deciding on the necessary actions.

While we know that there may be many valid reasons for a child to not be in school, it is important that we are transparent with families and work together to ensure that the children at Keyworth have the best possibility of achieving great things in the future - **poor attendance to school results in children falling behind where they should be both academically and emotionally**. We do not want to have to send letters, hold attendance panel meetings or make referrals of any kind so ask for your continued support with this matter - please contact the school if you would like to discuss your child's attendance to school and/or if you require any support with this.
