

## **Latest News**

#### Strike action

As a reminder, Keyworth will be closed to children on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March due to strike action. The NEU is in dispute with the Secretary of State for Education with regards to their failure to ensure enough money is available to pay a fully-funded increase in pay for teachers which at least matches inflation, and which begins to restore lost pay.

In consultation with the governors, the senior leaders of Keyworth have assessed the impact of the strike action on the school and after careful consideration have decided that the school will have to close to pupils. Due to the numbers of staff involved, there will be serious operational difficulties which could impact the safety of pupils and staff.

This decision has not been taken lightly and we regret having to take this action but feel that there will not be sufficient staff in school to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the children.

- > Our Little Stars provision will remain open. Please use Gaza Street gate.
- A packed lunch will be available for collection between 12:00pm and 1:00pm. Please call the school office by Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February to request a packed lunch.
- Afterschool club will be available between 3:30pm and 5:55pm. Children should be dropped-off promptly at 3:30pm via Sharsted Street entrance. Please book your child/ren's place/s using Magicbooking by Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> February.

Anyone who had previously booked our afterschool and/or breakfast clubs for Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March will be refunded as credit in their Magicbooking account.

Our sincere apologies for the difficulties that these arrangements will cause parents/carers but unfortunately these are circumstances beyond our control. The school will open as normal on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2023.

## Why are teachers taking strike action? (NEU)

- Fair pay for teachers: "Real term pay for experienced teachers has declined by 13% since 2010, and that over the same period average pay in the whole economy has increased by 2% in real terms. This adds up to a decline in teacher pay of 15%. Senior teachers in England have in effect had their pay cut by £6,600 since 2010." (Institute for Fiscal Studies)
- ➤ Budget struggles: "School spending per pupil in England fell by 9% in real terms between 2009-10 and 2019-20, the largest cut in over 40 years. The government has allocated an extra £7.1 billion for schools in England through to 2022-23. Whilst this will increase spending per pupil by over 8%, school spending per pupil in 2022-23 will still be 2% lower in real terms than in 2009-10." (Institute for Fiscal Studies)
- ➤ Workload: Due to the cuts to funding, teachers and school staff are having to do more as schools have had to reduce staffing levels and resourcing, and fill the gaps left by the cuts to other services.
- ➤ Keeping good teachers: "Nearly a third of teachers leave the profession within five years of qualifying, meaning schools have to employ supply staff and/or do not have enough qualified teaching staff to educate children effectively". (Department for Education data)

- Friday 3rd March!


  > Illustrate a new book cover interested in illustrations? Children can use the template given out in class to design their own book cover. Prizes to be won!



Throughout Children's Mental Health Week, the children learned about the importance of good mental health and discussed strategies for managing their mental health. The week ended with the children dressing to express who they are.




## **Nursery Reading Celebration Week**


For Nursery Reading Celebration Week, the children visited the school library and invited their parents/carers in to school to share their favourite books.
