

#### **Latest News**

#### **Coronavirus**

Throughout the last year and a half, the government has changed the rules around what schools should do when there are positive or suspected cases of coronavirus within the school community. I know that this can be very confusing for parents/carers, so I would like to summarise again. Please note that the following information is the law:

- ➢ If your child has symptoms of the coronavirus, then they should get a PCR test if old enough to do so and not come to school until confirmation of the results. If the result is positive, they should self-isolate as advised by *Track and Trace*. If the result is negative, they should return to school provided they no longer have coronavirus symptoms. This absence is authorised.
- ➤ If someone in your household tests positive for the coronavirus your child/ren are not expected to self-isolate and should still come to school as those under the age of 18 are not expected to self-isolate unless they have coronavirus symptoms or have a positive test result. You are advised to get a PCR test for your child/ren should this be the case.
- ➤ If someone in a class tests positive for the coronavirus, the school no longer needs to send other children home as those under the age of 18 are not expected to self-isolate. Track and Trace will fully manage any confirmed cases from now on.
- Any absence that does not meet the above criteria will be unauthorised and could result in the school having to follow the attendance guidance of making a referral to Southwark's attendance team.

I have mentioned on numerous occasions previously that Keyworth is doing extremely well as a school in terms of the teaching and learning, behaviour and safeguarding of the children. We are not doing as well when it comes to children's attendance to school and this, as it has been during my whole time at Keyworth, continues to be a key target for improvement. In order for this to improve, we are relying on families to ensure that their child/ren come to school as often as possible and that appointments be made outside of school time if you are able to do so. We all know that children's absence from school has a significant impact on their ability to reach their potential, not only now, but in the future as adults.

#### **Times Tables Rockstars competition KS2**

Last week, I announced that Keyworth was in 5<sup>th</sup> position out of 30 local schools (including secondary schools) on *Times Tables Rockstars*. We are hoping to break into the top 3 soon with your support!

A reminder that starting from Friday 17<sup>th</sup> September through to Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> October classes in KS2 will be competing to see which of them are the best at *Times Tables Rockstars* - will it by 6JA? Or maybe 4MV? You will find out soon...

# Speech and language drop-in sessions for children under five

Due to the ongoing coronavirus situation, and following current guidance from NHS England, face to face Chattertimes and drop-in sessions are no longer taking place. We are regularly reviewing the situation with the safety of our families and staff being our top priority.

If you are worried about your child's communication skills and your child is not known to our service, please email

gst-tr.contactslt@nhs.net stating your child's name, date of birth, and postcode and asking for a virtual drop-in appointment with a speech and language therapist. You will be given information about how to access our virtual drop-in sessions. These sessions are for parents/carers only.
