<u>Latest News</u>

Inspection data summary report

The Inspection data summary report provides published details of how schools are doing when compared with other schools. Below I have detailed the <u>latest</u> data for Keyworth that will be used by Ofsted during an inspection. First, we will start with the good news...

- Key stage 2 progress in reading (4.8) was significantly <u>above</u> national and in the <u>highest</u> 20% of all schools in 2019.
- Key stage 2 progress in writing (4.0) was significantly <u>above</u> national and in the <u>highest</u> 20% of all schools in 2019.
- Key stage 1 attainment of greater depth in writing (33%) was significantly <u>above</u> national and in the <u>highest</u> 20% of all schools in 2019.
- Key stage 2 progress in mathematics (3.7) was significantly <u>above</u> national and in the <u>highest</u> 20% of all schools in 2019.
- For middle prior attainers, key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in reading (92%) was significantly <u>above</u> national in 2019.
- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in reading, writing and mathematics (76%) was significantly <u>above</u> national in 2019.
- Key stage 2 attainment of the expected standard (100+) in the English grammar, punctuation and spelling test (92%) was significantly <u>above</u> national in 2019.

Now, the bad news...

Overall absence in summer 2021 (5.5%) was in the <u>highest</u> 20% of all schools. Overall absence in autumn 2020 (5.2%) was in the <u>highest</u> 20% of all schools.

Persistent absence (below 90% attendance) in autumn 2020 (19.9%) was in the <u>highest</u> 20% of all schools.

The senior leaders were already aware of all the above but I thought that it would be useful to share the details with our families. As you can see, there are many things that are going really well at Keyworth. I have pointed out previously that attendance of children to Keyworth is a real concern and one that will mean that Keyworth will not do as well under future inspections of the school, which is an unfair reflection of what actually goes on in school. We really need the help of our families with attendance - please ensure that your child/ren attend school every day unless absolutely necessary, that you do not book term-time holidays and that you try to make appointments outside of school time. Going forward, we have been advised by Southwark Council to make more referrals to them with a view to families being prosecuted if their child/ren has/have poor attendance.

Parent workshop - children's sleeping difficulties

Children struggling to sleep was a key issue in our recent children's survey. *The Nest Southwark* offer free and confidential mental wellbeing advice and support for young people. They will be delivering a workshop at Keyworth on Friday 24th June at 9:10am with support and guidance around sleeping issues. Refreshments will be provided.

Jewellery

We have noticed that more and more children are wearing jewellery to school. Children are only allowed to wear studded earrings, watches or necklaces that are worn for religious observance. All other jewellery is banned. If there is another type of jewellery that your child has to wear for religious purposes, please contact the school office with further details.

If children are found to be wearing jewellery that is banned, they will be warned not to wear it the next day. If this continues, the children will be asked to remove the jewellery with staff returning it to parents/carers. Jewellery poses a health and safety risk and is not part of our school uniform policy.
