

Parent/carer conduct

MasterChef

MasterChef concluded The British Nutrition Foundation Healthy Eating Week. Each year group in the school focused on one herb as the centrepiece for their learning, which included learning about the importance of herbs in our diet, how and where the herb is grown and its benefits to our health. During MasterChef, the children created food inspired by their herb and presented their dishes to an expert panel of judges, alongside a short video introduction. This week, 6CS visited Southwark's Integrated Waste Management Facility (IWMF). They began the day in The Recycling Discovery Centre (RDC) which is an interactive indoor space. In the RDC, the children engaged with the mini Materials Recovery Facility and participated in a range of activities to learn about the recycling process.

They then went on a tour of the Materials Recovery Facility (MRF). The MRF is one of the most advanced recycling facilities in Europe. All materials collected for recycling from homes across Southwark are processed at this plant before being sent off to manufacturers to turn the recycled raw materials into new products!


