

Keyworth Primary School - "Living with Covid"

I was speaking with several parents earlier this week about how and when Keyworth is "opening up" after the pandemic. I am pleased to report that Keyworth is **OPEN**...

- Most of our usual systems and procedures are in place as they were prior to the pandemic. Staff and children can mix throughout the school; in-person assemblies have returned; external music, PE and wider-curriculum visitors and events/activities are back etc.
- ➤ We have reflected and made some changes to our school day, for example, only allowing parents/carers into school at hometime to ensure a smooth and prompt start to the school day. Additionally, our playgrounds continue to be divided into smaller areas to ensure less accidents occur. If your child/ren attend/s Little Stars or Nursery, please walk round to Gaza Gate and do not cut through the school due to safeguarding purposes and to follow the rules.
- > At the start of the next academic year, class assemblies will be returning.

As a reminder, should you wish to communicate with your child/ren's class teacher/s, you can do so at the end of the school day or by contacting the school office to arrange an appointment. Parents/carers should speak to class teachers directly and before communicating with a member of the Senior Leadership Team should there be any questions or queries.

As a result of our quality provision, we were selected as a model of excellence and on Wednesday we were visited by a group of funders who support the provision of free breakfast to children in schools. They saw our Breakfast Club, Bagel Station, Early Years' Breakfast Stations and spoke with several children about the importance of having breakfast. The feedback was extremely positive and Keyworth was described as have the feeling of "an amazing school".
