


Industrial action - reminder

The NEU has announced further industrial action, with strikes taking place on Wednesday 5th and Friday 7th July. As the majority of our teachers are in the NEU and will be taking strike action, we will need to close the school to the majority of children on these days. This is because, after consultation with the governors based on risk assessment, it is not possible to stay open on strike days with the high number of absent staff while maintaining health and safety standards for pupils and staff, and reasonable working conditions for those staff not involved in the industrial action.

- > Year 6 will remain open from 9:00am to 3:30pm. Please use Gaza Street gate. A cooked school lunch will be provided.
- For children not in school, a packed lunch will be available for collection between 12:00pm and 1:00pm on each day. Please call the school office by Monday 3rd July to request a packed lunch for each strike day.
- Afterschool club will be available between 3:30pm and 5:55pm. Children should be dropped-off promptly at 3:30pm via Sharsted Street entrance. Please book your child/ren's place/s using Magicbooking by Monday 3rd July. If your child is in year 6, they will be taken to afterschool club by school staff.

Anyone who had previously booked our afterschool and/or breakfast clubs for these days will be refunded as credit in their Magicbooking account.




Reception visited the Horniman Museum

With the end of the academic year approaching, we appreciate that change can be difficult for children and families. Should you need further support with any specific issues, the Parent Consultation Service may be able to help!

Why consultation?

Consultation may be helpful when people want to think about changing difficult situations.

The Parent Consultation Service offers parents and carers an opportunity to request consultation about the concerns they have about their children at home, for example:

- A parent is concerned about their child's emotional well-being.
- A child behaves well in school or nursery, but is difficult to manage at home.
- A child is having difficulty managing their feelings.
- · A child is unhappy at a time of change or loss.
- A young person is getting into trouble outside of school.

What is involved in consultation?

In consultation, we talk together about a range of ideas and different possibilities for action to ease concerns.

Consultation is a non-judgemental approach.

Each appointment lasts about an hour, and follow-up meetings can be agreed.

Will my information be shared?

This is a confidential service for parents and carers, and information will not be shared more broadly except in line with safeguarding guidelines which all professional are obliged to follow.

Who is providing this service?

Consultation for parents and carers will be provided by members of Southwark's Educational Psychology Service.

Is this the right service?

If you are wondering whether this is the right service for you, please email the address below to ask for a discussion.

Where does the consultation take place?

Appointments will be offered at a convenient location for parents or carers.


