We have had a great week in Nursery! We have been learning all about bears.


We sparked the children's curiosity by turning one of our classrooms into a cave, where we found a bear who was quite upset about not having any friends.

Core Books

In order to support our emergent readers in Nursery we use a core book scheme.

Nursery will have four core books that will be read throughout the year on a regular basis so that the children are able to retell the story themselves, even though they will not be able to read the words. This builds the children's confidence in reading and allows them to see themselves as a reader. It also supports their storytelling, speaking and their understanding.

There will be numerous copies of these core books in the setting, along with the rest of the high-quality texts on offer, and there will be opportunities for the children to take it in turns to take a copy home with them. If you have access to a library or are able to visit a bookshop/ 2nd hand book shop, such as Oxfam on Half Moon Lane, it is also a nice idea to have these books at home to expose your child to these books further. The core books have been chosen to reflect the children's interests, develop specific skills and support our focus on diversity and challenging stereotypes.

- Dear Zoo by Rod Campbell
- Peace at Last by Jill Murphy

Class Bears

The children have been introduced to our Class Bears. In Ladybird Class this is Barnaby Bear and in Butterfly Class is Bobbie Bear.

Each week, the Bears will be sent home with a member of the class to go on an Adventure. This needs to be recorded on Tapestry which the teacher will then print and place into our Bear News Folder. All information can be found on the first page of the Bear News Folder but please feel free to ask your child's teacher if you are unsure.

This experience will not only build confidence but will allow your child an opportunity to speak in front of their peers, sharing a lived experience and speaking about something which they will find exciting.
