Parent Workshops

Over the Christmas Holidays, Ms Rose and Ms Mucci have been busy creating some parent workshops which have been uploaded to Goole Classroom. These cover the topics of Phonics and Fine Motor Skills within the Early Years setting. Wellies and coats

As the weather gets wetter and colder, please provide your children with a named, thick, winter coat and suitable footwear. We go to the Nature Garden three times a week and it is important that children are suitably dressed. Children have the opportunity to explore and experiment with water whilst at school. We try our best to keep your child dry by encouraging the use of aprons and rolling up of sleeves but if you know your child particularly enjoys water play, please could you provide them with a waterproof jacket / suit. If you do not have one, we are happy to provide one for you. Please also encourage your child to practise putting on their wellies and coats independently.

Water Bottles

Please ensure your child has a named water bottle with them each day. This should only contain water, no fruit juices or squash please!

Spare Clothes

Please make sure that your child always has a spare change of clothes at school for toileting accidents and water play. If your child borrows clothes from school, please return the clothes washed and dried. If you have any socks that your child no longer needs, we would really appreciate any donations for our spare clothes box!

Toileting

If your child please requires support with toileting, please continue to practise this at home and remind them of the importance of thorough hand washing.

Tapestry
