












Things to remember...

Reading Expectations

We want to instil a love of reading for pleasure from an early age and would highly recommend reading to your child each day. Reading is an essential part of your child's development. It introduces children to words they wouldn't usually hear in everyday conversations, helps build their vocabulary and supports their listening and attention skills. Please continue to read daily with your child and remember to sign

their reading record. Each week we check every child's reading record and give out rewards based off how many reads they have done. The children love receiving these rewards so please don't forget to sign!

We would like to clarify that reading books will <u>only be changed on a Wednesday</u> if we see evidence in the reading record that <u>each book</u> has been read <u>at least three times</u>.

Please ensure your child brings their <u>reading record and reading book to school every day.</u>
Please note, if a child loses or damages a school reading book, a letter will be sent home to parents requesting £5 to replace the book.

Reading Volunteers

We are looking for any parent volunteers who would like to spend a morning or afternoon reading 1:1 with children. Please let your child's class teacher know if you would be happy to do so.

Forest School

As the weather is becoming wet and cold, we ask if you could please provide your children with a waterproof jacket/wet suit. If you do not have one, we are happy to provide one for you.
